Children's Classic Concerts (CCC) are delighted to report on another extremely rewarding Season of exhilarating orchestral performances for families across Scotland.

During 2023/24, we have taken audiences on captivating journeys: back in time to medieval days; inside the imaginative mind of Roald Dahl; into outer space; across Europe with 'Django the Cat'; within the tale of Peter and the Wolf, and along the way, we've encouraged young people to enjoy the freedom of creating their own musical stories.

We're confident that relatable themes such as these, have helped us to reframe the stereotype of classical music. Unique programming and plots for each concert, together with plenty of audience participation and humour, has captured imaginations - evidenced in feedback received.

CCC has commissioned and premiered 7 new arrangements including 3 medleys by Paul Campbell, bringing lesser known classics together with film and TV scores.

Longstanding partnerships with the RSNO (and its Youth Chorus), Manor School of Ballet, and the University of the West of Scotland (UWS) were further strengthened this Season, and we have nurtured newer relationships; with Education Scotland and rising composer, Aileen Sweeney – who re-worked her Percussion Concerto for Owen Gunnell and our Essential Orchestra. Professional collaboration has been identified as one of five Aims in our Business Plan to 2028, which we have amended over the past few months. Additional aims are: recognition and aspiration; cohesive programming; digital integration and audience connection.

Regarding the latter, we've already made progress with two successful Family Forum meetings online and our first in-person gathering has been arranged for September 2024. It's been a real pleasure hearing about the CCC experience from different perspectives.

Equivalent to 51% of CCC's total reach in 2023/24, our flagship RSNO performances delighted once again. The medieval-inspired programme welcomed guest actor, Ryan Ferrie (a Royal Conservatoire of Scotland graduate) and featured the symphonic premiere of Paul Campbell's 'Jabberwocky' (originally commissioned by CCC for our Essential Orchestra in 2021) - with Paul in the Edinburgh audience. This piece was narrated by Ryan, along with expressive British Sign Language interpretation provided by Paul Whittaker OBE.

'The Elf Games' marked the 16th festive production of our partnership. Gold-medal worthy performances were given by the RSNO Youth Chorus (many members on stage with the orchestra for the first time) and Manor School of Ballet dancers - taking part in a third of the programme each, and facilitating the storytelling and comedy moments beautifully. 208 free tickets were offered via our network of social inclusion charities and 67 % (139) were taken up on the day – the highest percentage yet.

The Essential Orchestra format is CCC's sweet spot – large enough to make an impressive sound, but compact enough to afford musicians flexibility to create an atmosphere that truly engages.

'Out of this World' was the new addition this year for our collection of Essential Orchestra programmes and attracted the highest number of evaluation survey responses of the Season. Families from CCC's Residency School, Dunard Primary (see Strand 5) attended a dress rehearsal as VIP quests.

Kicking off the Season, we made a first-time appearance at Fringe by the Sea Festival, reaching an audience of 696, which is a record-breaking inaugural figure for us. This has led to a 3-year commitment to visiting East Lothian and building a base in a new area for CCC.

Through our Gypsy Jazz 'Django's Journey' project, Seonaid Aitken (award-winning violinist), enabled children to hear the fiddle out with the Traditional Scottish folk music context (often a focus for island communities). Seonaid won the Leonard Friedman Award at Mendelssohn on Mull in 1996 at age 18 and was gifted a violin with a small map of Mull painted on its scroll. It's still her instrument today – a unique connection to the island and local children who listened to her play.

'Big Top Brass' was another fresh programme for 2023/24 and didn't disappoint. Colourful staging matched the vibrancy of the musical performances by Thistle Brass Quintet, CCC's Artistic Director / Presenter, Owen Gunnell and guest percussionist and magician from the Magic Circle, Patrick King. Owen and Patrick are old friends and this translated into their amusing and natural presentation, instigating lots of laughter from the audience. Live magic tricks were hugely entertaining, creating a real buzz, yet they didn't overshadow the music.

STRAND 4: DIGITAL ACTIVITY MUSIC SPARKS





2023/24 marked a shift in the shape of the CCC Season. Concert films that proved hugely popular in 2020/21, when we were forced to cancel live events, have now paved the way to a more 'hybrid' approach. Our aforementioned 'Digital Integration' aim has begun to be realised, with the creation of a concert film (Django's Journey) and 2 accompanying learning resources in addition to our live activity.

Crucial in the development of the resources has been our new partnership with Education Scotland (ES), allowing us to create content that fulfils experiences and outcomes linked to Expressive Arts; Literacy; Social Studies; and Health and Wellbeing areas of the Curriculum for Excellence. They will shortly both be available to every Primary School in Scotland via the 'Practitioner Resources' tab on the ES website – a trusted location for teachers.



'Roving Reviewers' contains ready-to-use, imaginative activities, that will empower young people to rate their cultural experiences and express their opinions.

'Django's Journey' maps-out the Gypsy Jazz genre with imaginative games and geographical quizzes, contributing to children's inter-cultural understanding.

The Django's Journey concert film was recorded at Clockwork Studios during February 2024 by CCC consultant, Scott Mackenzie, assisted by 19-year-old Max McGregor, an emerging filmmaker (winner of the Generation Z Young Filmmaker of the Year Award, 2018), who grew up attending CCC concerts. Students from UWS created animations, benefiting from the experience as a complementary component to their studies. The film is due to be launched in September 2024.

We supported 350 young people facing socioeconomic disadvantage through Year 1 of our Residency at Dunard Primary School, located in an SIMD1 area (Maryhill, Glasgow). CCC musicians delivered 21 sessions – and 8 enthusiastic pupils were selected to work with professional reviewer, Kelly Apter, to produce a 10-minute film that forms an integral part of the Roving Reviewers resource.

CCC was trusted to be present while HM Inspectors of Education (HMIE) were in school. There was also a separate visit from the current Minister for Culture while our musicians were delivering sessions. We are keenly interested in supporting pupils throughout their primary school experience, endeavouring to measure any changes in behaviour / morale and positive impact on wider learning while we are resident.

COMMITMENTS

EQUALITY, DIVERSITY & INCLUSION

- British Sign Language (BSL) interpretation was given at 6 performances, where narration / song featured.
- Audio Description was delivered at a performance of each RSNO concert.
- Applicable events were listed on the Access Scottish Theatre Calendar website.
- We showcased female talent through all strands composers, performers and workshop leaders.
- Ticket prices remained comparatively low our audience survey rated our affordability 4.2 out of 5.
- 696 free tickets were offered via our social inclusion network of charities, including for Ukrainian refugees and family members with mental health conditions.

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY

- 53% of our surveyed audience travelled either by walking / cycling, public transport, or hybrid/electric car.
- 1,291 miles were covered 'sustainably' by CCC staff / musicians by Ferry or Train, for our Highlands and Islands touring.
- In April 2024, our Environmental Impact Policy was updated to include a child-friendly version.

FAIR WORK






- Commemorating 30 Years of CCC, we intend to revisit some of our best projects, with fresh twists. RSNO performances will comprise a live version of our popular 2020 film, 'The Haunted Concert Hall', and the festive offering will celebrate CCC's past, present and future by way of 'A Christmas Carol'.
- Another new film and 2 resources are due to be created, solidifying the enhanced 'hybrid' look of CCC's Season.
- We aim to extend our accessible format provision beyond Strands 1 and 2.
- Composer, Aileen Sweeney, will be commissioned by us to write a fully original piece for the Essential Orchestra as the focal point of a new programme; 'Honey, I Shrunk the Orchestra'. Entitled, 'The Waggle Dance', the piece will take inspiration from bees, and how they work together – with Owen set to spread melodies to each section of musicians (worker bees), echoing the "Young Person's Guide to the Orchestra".
